


Patient information

A radiographer will collect you from the waiting room.

They wear a red uniform.



Your friend or carer can wait close by for you outside of the scan room.



The scan will take 5 minutes.



The radiographer will help you lie on the bed and make you comfortable.

You will need to lie very still.



The scanner uses x-rays to take pictures of your head.

It is not loud; it sounds like a washing machine.

The bed will move in and out of the hole as it takes the pictures.



The radiographer can see you during the scan.

They will tell you when the scan is finished.
